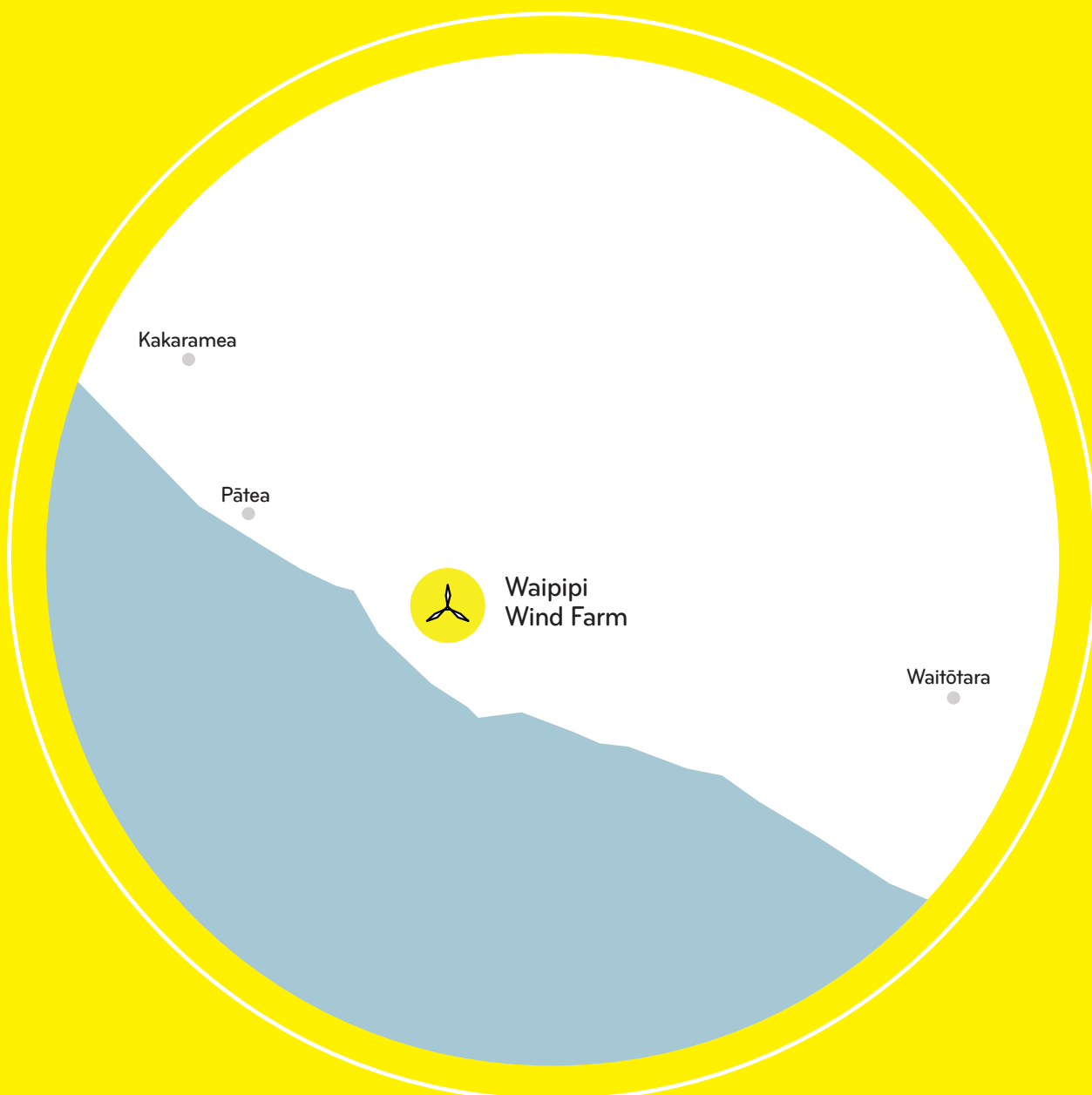




THE WAIPIPI WIND FARM COMMUNITY FUND

The Mercury Waipipi Wind Farm Community Fund is here to support organisations and projects that benefit the communities around this wind farm.

Applications must relate to an identified individual or community group in the area surrounding the Waipipi wind farm (defined as the Pātea Ward of the South Taranaki District Council).



BEFORE YOU START

Before you fill out the following application form, please take a minute to ensure your organisation is eligible for a grant. Read about the Fund and the kind of things we will support, to have the best chance of a successful application.

What this Community Fund is for.

The Mercury Waipipi Wind Farm Community Fund is here to support organisations and projects that benefit the communities around our wind farm.

How much is offered, and how often?

This Fund amount changes each year but is currently a total of around \$30,000 across two funding rounds to be shared within this community each year. Twice a year, applications will be open for one month, and this will be advertised to the community and on the Mercury website.

FUNDING ROUND 1	
Applications open	1 October
Applications close	31 November
Decisions made & advised, payments made	December - January

FUNDING ROUND 2	
Applications open	1 March
Applications close	30 April
Decisions made & advised, payments made	May - June

How we choose which projects to fund.

Applications to the Fund are considered by a small group of local people who have a good understanding of the communities around the wind farm, in the area covered by the Fund. We may not be able to accept all requests, or to support any request in full.

All applications are assessed against the criteria below, and those that best meet these will have the greatest chance of success. We might ask you for further information in considering applications or proposals.

Funding criteria: what kind of projects are funded.

Applications for funding for community projects should meet one or more of these criteria, that are aligned with Mercury's core community values:

Ngā Tangata - People
- to live better lives (schools/kura, upskilling, inclusion & diversity) - connections between people (clubs, events) - safety and wellbeing (public safety, supporting health and mental health)
Kaitiakitanga - Stewardship
- care for the environment - long term inter generational thinking - New Zealand's decarbonisation journey (such as supporting bikes and e-vehicles)

Who can apply?

Individuals and charitable or non-profit organizations may apply. Applications should focus on projects or community groups near the wind farm shown in the map on page one (that represents the Pātea Ward of the South Taranaki District Council).

Applications will not be considered from or in respect of any of the following:

- Commercial or profit orientated organisations or individuals
- Projects with a religious or political purpose (although we do accept applications from church groups towards a social/community purpose)
- Completed projects
- In addition, we look carefully before supporting any clubs or projects that involve animals

Applications will not be accepted by organisations or individuals that have previously received funding from Mercury and:

- Did not deliver the project as described in the original application
- Did not supply a Report Back Form within the agreed time frame as required
- Did not return funds where the project was not implemented as agreed (this does not apply to successful applicants who return funds where the actual cost of their project fell below their proposed project cost).
- We want to share the Fund around, so each organisation or individual may have one successful application per year.

Successful applicants: telling the story.

We'd really like it if successful applicants talked about their funding to help spread the message about this Community Fund. This could be acknowledgment in a newsletter, Facebook or other communication. If you would like to use Mercury logo somewhere, we would be happy to send it to you.

Successful applicants may also be involved in promotion of the Mercury Waipipi Wind Farm Community Fund to the media, and in Mercury's social media and other channels.

If your application is successful and you accept the grant, you agree to participate in any publicity generated by Mercury (or Mercury's marketing partners), and to the use of the applicant's name, project that the grant has been awarded for and photos of the finished product for promotional purposes.

Letting us know how it's gone ("reporting back").

Once the project or initiative is completed, all successful applicants must complete a Report Back form. The Report Back form can be found here

If the project is not implemented as agreed, or where the actual cost of the project falls below the proposed project cost, please contact us to return funds.
